```
enable (enter privilege exec mode from user mode)
configure terminal (enters global configuration mode)
hostname NYEDGE1 (configures hostname)
show ip interface brief (shows interface configure)
show controllers serial 0/0/0 (shows hardware status)
show ip protocols (NSF = non stop forwarding)
show version (shows current IOS version)
copy running-config startup-config (saves the configuration to NVRAM)
```
